Snow/Ice Removal

As the weather starts to get colder, and we all have seen the first snow fall, it's time to get out that snow-blower, snow plow or shovel as the snow/ice removal ordinance is put into action. Reminder that sidewalks must be clear of snow in 24 hours. When ice is formed, owner or occupant has 12 hours to remove or cause salt, sawdust, sand or other abrasive. Whereas snow or ice is not cleared within the time frame, a citation or fine shall be issued by the City. The City has a list of people that want to help those in the community this winter season. If you or someone you know in the community needs help removing snow from their driveway or sidewalk so they can have access to and from their house, and other places within the City in a safe manner, contact City Hall at 517-645-7641.
